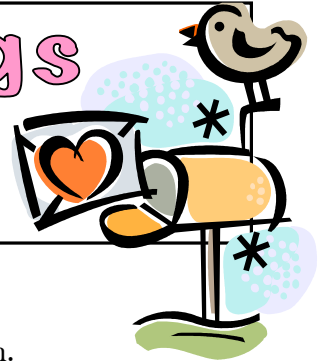

Pastor's Musings

I've noticed that of late it is still only dusk when I head home from the office at 5:00pm.

What a welcome change from the darkness that I was driving home in back in December and January.

The lengthening of the daylight hours is a sure sign that winter is passing and spring will arrive in a couple of months.

This change in nature serves as a reminder that Lent, the church season of reflection and cleansing, is approaching. This year Lent begins on February 22nd since Easter will be observed on April 8th.

During these forty days all Christians are encouraged to do a "spring cleaning of the soul," so that the renewal offered in the resurrection of Jesus may be a reality in our lives and congregations. For some this cleansing includes the giving up of something for Lent, for others it involves the adding of a spiritual discipline (such as more focused attention to prayer), as a way of putting aside those things that hinder spiritual growth while enriching one's life with those practices and thoughts that foster a relationship with God.

Whatever you choose to practice during the season of Lent, I invite you to include a renewed commitment to worship and study. Both of these can be done by making a decision, and carrying through on it, to attend Sunday Worship and the special Lenten services.

May you have a blessed Lent that brings you to a joyous Easter.

Saturday Dinner and Fellowship

Last month's winter weather forced us to postpone the Covered-dish Dinner and Fellowship to February 11th at 6:00pm. This month's dinner is one that each family is asked to contribute to by bringing a covered-dish entree to be shared at our church family dinner table.

Beverages and dessert will be provided. All are invited to join in this evening of good food and fellowship!

Taize Service

The Taize Service which was to have been held in January, but had to be postponed because of winter weather, will be held on Saturday, February 11th at 5:00pm.

All are welcome to gather in the sanctuary for a time of song, prayer and reflection.

If you are attending the Service, and also plan to attend the dinner at 6:00pm, please bring your covered-dish entree to the kitchen before the Service. If it needs to be kept warm, the ovens will be on low heat, and there will also be warming trays available for your use.

Ash Wednesday Service

We will observe the start of Lent with a special service on Ash Wednesday, February 22 at 7:30pm. This service will include the imposition of ashes and the celebration of Holy Communion.

Midweek Lenten Services

On the Wednesdays of Lent leading up to Holy Week, we will hold lenten worship services at 7:30pm. These services are part of our congregational and personal observance of this holy season in preparation for the celebration of Easter and its invitation for renewal.

Our Prayer List - Time for a Lenten Cleansing One of our core beliefs is the power of prayer and its importance in our lives. This is why we maintain a prayer request list and hold a monthly prayer service.

Since the prayer list is a key component in our prayer life, we strive to keep it as current as possible, focusing of course on those with pressing needs and concerns. Over time the list grows and periodically needs a major overhaul.

The time has come for such a major overhaul of the prayer list.

In keeping with the lenten discipline of cleansing, the prayer list will be completely redone in time for the February prayer service.

This means there will be a **COMPLETELY NEW PRAYER LIST**. If you have placed people on the prayer list, you must put them back on before Monday, February 27th.

Please note: there will be no carryover of the names now on the list, so be sure to get in all prayer requests before the 27th.

Forms for placing people on the prayer list are on the table in the narthex. If you would prefer not to use the form, you can e-mail your requests to the church office.

AGAIN - AS OF FEBRUARY 27TH THERE WILL BE A COMPLETELY NEW PRAYER LIST AND ONLY THOSE NAMES SUBMITTED TO THE OFFICE BETWEEN FEBRUARY 1 AND FEBRUARY 26 WILL APPEAR ON THE LIST.

We want to continue this important ministry and need your help at this time to improve this ministry of St. Paul's.

The TRIALS of Jesus This year the special Lenten Services (Midweek, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday) will focus on the theme of the trials of Jesus. At each service the focus will be on a witness who gives testimony about his encounter with the accused - Jesus Christ. Through their accounts we will gain a better understanding of what Christ accomplished through his ministry, death and resurrection.

The first will be held on Ash Wednesday with the witness being Satan. The text will be, Matthew 4:1-11. The second will be held on February 29th at 7:30pm with the witness being Judas. The text will be Mark 14:16, 32-42.

Pastor's Report: Beverly Bell will preach April 15th during Pastor's vacation. He needs to get coverage for two other Sundays. The Lenten program is set and the theme is The Trials of Jesus. A letter was sent to the Village of Babylon to request the use of the gazebo on Easter morning. Sign up for the church retreat has begun. The theme will be The Parables of Jesus. A bible study is beginning this Sunday with 16 people signed up. Pastor handed out the 2012 communication chain. John Alteri will be handling putting the St. Paul's booster ad in the Little League catalogue. Pastor is requesting a fund be set aside as a Pastor's Discretionary Fund. Linda Pantaleo made a motion that this fund be established at \$500 in food coupons. It was seconded by C. Lento and passed.

Update on Natural Church Development: The Taize service and Pot Luck Dinner will be rescheduled for February 11th.

Congregational Annual Meeting: Pastor asked if any issues were raised during the congregational meeting which needed to be addressed. As the decrease in church attendance was mentioned as a concern it was suggested that the first Sunday Committee meeting be for Church Growth. This should be held on February 26th.

Finance Committee: (B. Milligan) The balance sheet was distributed. Pastor asked what was the remaining \$238 in mission. Denise said \$100 is to be given to replenish the kitchen and \$138 is going to the Babylon Food Pantry. There are some other miscellaneous expenses which Denise will be offsetting. Cheryl was concerned regarding the balance in the Sunday school account. A fund raising meeting was held and events have been scheduled throughout the year. The Tea will be held in February, Easter candy will be done in February/March. In April a yard sale/car wash is being planned. The car show is May 19th. The rain date is May 26th. The St. Paul's Un Picnic will begin in June. The Ferry Bake is scheduled for July 13th. The Duck's Game is August 4th. A military bridge night will be scheduled in September. The cookie and craft sale will be held in November/December. Cindy is looking into a Samaritan card which would replace the Entertainment Books. We could make \$8 a card. Some more research will be done on this. Betty had a suggestion to look into buying our gas from a third party. Scott is going to look into this.

Worship: (C. Lavorata) A worship meeting was held in early January. Phil Leun is away for two weeks. Substitute organists have been scheduled. The Communion Pancake breakfast will be on February 12th at 9 am sharp. Ash Wednesday is February the 22nd with communion at 7:30 pm, March 31st is the Spring Clean Up. Palm Sunday is April 1st with communion. Communion will also be celebrated Maundy Thursday and Easter. The nursery is being cleaned up and a babysitter has been engaged. We will have a baptism on March 18th. There are no children to be confirmed this year but Pentecost falls on May 27th this year.

Property: (S. Olsen) All the outside lights have been fixed. The light in the front sign is now working and the base has been secured. The ladies room bathroom is being fixed this week. An AA group will be meeting here on Wednesday's starting on February 1st. They will donate \$50 a month and we will set up room for their storage space. A gamblers anonymous group has now requested space for Fridays. A motion was made by S. Olsen to offer this space. It was seconded by L. Pantaleo and passed.

Mission: (B. Walters)

The Babylon Food Pantry is in dire need of food. Barbara wants to remind everyone of the basket in the east room. A collection will also be made outside of Pathmark on February 4th. The February mission is the Heart Association. In March Barbara would like to organize a "Daffodil Day" for American Cancer Society.

Pre-School Committee: (J. Altieri) The 4 year old classes are full and we have lost a net of one in the 3 year old classes. The committee has decided not to go forward with the 5 day program. The registration for the 2012/2013 has started for current students. In early February it will be opened to the public. The preschool will be advertised in the local paper. Marissa is attending preschool fairs in two of the local libraries.

Christian Education: (C. Lento) The 10:30 Sunday school is having good attendance. The 9:30 Sunday school has 6 children but two are not attending as regularly. Woman's Fellowship was well attended in January. A new program was started. Women's study group met on the 17th. The next meeting is February 21st.

Stewardship: (D. Miller) Nothing new to report. Denise is beginning to do some research for this year.

Church Growth: (L. Pantaleo) Linda would like to focus on existing members who are no longer coming. She also suggested that quarterly financial statements be discontinued. This will be brought up at the next Finance meeting. New avenues will be explored at the February 26th meeting.
